Subject: Science (Chemistry)


Task 1: Laboratory Safety

What do I have to include?

Task 1 – Needs to be completed by: <u>25th September 2017</u>

This task is all about laboratory safety.

a) Name the following laboratory hazards from their symbols: (Hint you will find these in your Science laboratory)



b) Create a poster to list 10 key Science laboratory rules, this poster must include pictures and images of the potential hazards and the rules must ensure the safety of every student.



Task 2: Can you see me breathe?

What do I have to include?

A clear method, a clearly explained write up of your observations and conclusions, addressing all tasks Your report should be <u>at least 200 words</u>

Task 2 – Needs to be completed by: 25th September 2017

This task is all about water and what happens when it changes state.

Some Facts

Water can be found in three states; **solid** ("ice"), **liquid** ("water") and **gas** ("steam" or "Vapour"). When you breathe out, there is lots of water vapour in your breath. If you breathe onto cold glass the water vapour cools and **condenses** (it changes from a gas to a liquid); the glass 'steams up'.

a) You will need to carry out this experiment: Freezing your breath.

- i) Read the method below, using the ideas from the facts above, predict what will happen.
- ii) Carry out the investigation.

Method

- 1. Take a clean dry glass.
- 2. Place your glass in a freezer for about 20 minutes (no longer).
- 3. Carefully remove the glass from the freezer.
- 4. Breathe gently onto the glass and see what happens....

b) Explaining what happened

- 1) Write down what you saw (you can take photographs)
- 2) Did your observations match your prediction. Try to explain what happened

CHALLENGE: On a winter's day you can often see your breathe as clouds of mist. What do you think causes this?

Useful keywords: vapour, condense, freeze, cool, ice

Task 3: What causes potholes?

Task 3 needs to be completed by 9th OCTOBER 2017

What do I have to include?

Task 3 is composed of two parts; an experiment and a write up of this experiment. You will need to include to photographs or drawings of your experiment and your write up should be at least 200 words.

3a) This task is all about water freezing. You will need to carry out a test at home:

Water is an unusual substance because when it freezes, it **expands**. As trapped water freezes and expands it can produce enormous forces. These forces are big enough to create potholes in roads.



- i) Read the method below. What do you predict will happen? Explain your ideas using facts about water.
- ii) Now carry out the investigation below.

The Experiment – The force of freezing water...

Method

- 1. Take a small plastic drinks bottle.*
- 2. Fill to the very top with water.
- 3. Screw the lid on tightly.
- 4. Place in the freezer overnight.....
 - * the bottle MUST be plastic, glass will break into very sharp pieces.
- 5. Breathe gently onto the glass and see what happens....

3b) Explaining what happened

- 1) Copy the method
- 2) Write down what you saw (you can take photographs)
- 3) Try to explain what happened

CHALLENGE: How do you think water causes road potholes?

Task 4: What causes frostbite?

What do I have to include?

You will need to include a report that is at least 200 words

Task 4 needs to be completed by 9th OCTOBER 2017

This task is all about frost bite and water freezing.

Some Facts

Research task

The cells in your body contain lots of water (just like the plastic drinks bottle in task 3). If the water in these cells freezes, it will expand and damage the cell causing frostbite

(see picture at the top of the page of frost bitten fingertips)

Your research task is to find out:

- Which parts of the body are most likely to be affected by frostbite?
- What medical problems it can cause?
- What causes frostbite?
- How do doctors treat frostbite

You may present your research in writing; as a poster, a leaflet or as a powerpoint presentation. (Your presentation needs to be less than 200 words.

- Research this dance in detail;
- Create a piece of extended writing explaining this dance. Include the types of movements performed; where is comes from; how it links to historical events and other important definitions. Use pictures and text. There is a writing frame on 'Moodle' to help you.

Task 3 - Needs to be completed by: *individual teachers will confirm dates in planner*

- Design a costume that could be worn as part of the dance you selected for Task 2. Draw a detailed image. Annotate (label) your image to explain the front and back designs, what textiles would be used and any key words.
- EXTENSION: Find some images or photographs of things linked to your dance. Create a collage around the edge to show some of the textures, colours and symbols that could be included.

Choosing a book and predictions – Strand 1

Choose a **fiction book** which you are going to read over the course of this half term. Ensure that it is one that you are going to stay interested in and make sure that it is challenging enough for you. Speak to your English teacher and the library staff if you need advice.

Read the opening few chapters and then look closely at the front cover and the blurb. In a few paragraphs explain what made you choose this novel, what you think is going to happen in the story and who your favourite character is so far.

Task 2 – Needs to be completed by: Friday 22nd September 2017

Create a diary entry - Strands 1 and 2

As you continue to read, create a diary entry exploring how one of the characters feels or what they are thinking at that point in the novel. What questions would they be asking themselves and what is running through their heads?

Research the author - Strands 1 and 6

Research and make a context page which tells us lots of information about the author. Consider:

- What can you find out about the author's life?
- What other books have they written?
- Have they ever said anything about their work or been interviewed about it?
