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# Message from the Head



Returning to school after the Summer break began with staff training, which included safeguarding and high expectations around behaviour (including the introduction of our 3 school rules – Ready, Respectful and Safe), the effective principles of high quality teaching/planning, and supporting regulation for children who are neurodivergent, to name a few. This work was the start of our focus and drive for school improvement during this academic year.

The start of the academic year for children was impressive too and the children looked incredibly smart. I was particularly impressed with our Year 7 and Year 11 pupils, with our older pupils demonstrating great responsibility in making sure that the younger pupils were able to navigate their timetables as well as navigate the school building. It is incredible to think that this was 7 weeks ago. Our Year 7 pupils are now settled and confident in the routines of the school day. Our Year R pupils are equally confident, and they have also become familiar with the new school routines, including developing their knowledge and understanding of letters and sounds in phonics.

I have continued to be impressed with the children during assembly time too. The arrival to and exit from can never be taken for



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granted, and it is the perfect way to ensure that we are all ready to hear the key messages and themes. The children across the school have shown respect to others whilst waiting to enter the hall, mindful that other pupils are learning. Furthermore, we have now established a fire drill in silence!

Throughout this half term, we held our Parent and Community evening which included a SEND review with attendance from the Mental Health Support Team and the Neurodiversity Team, as well as a Classcharts and revision talk. This also gave leaders an opportunity to respond to questions about the school's expectations. It was after this event that I received an email from a parent to say '...a quick note to say thank you to those who facilitated, and presented at, Tuesday's Community Event... each time I am more convinced that we made absolutely the right decision in choosing Mayfield. The patience, enthusiasm and dedication of the staff are infectious and reassuring. There were some great suggestions on how to support our children's learning and consolidate their knowledge in fun and family-friendly ways. Please extend my

appreciation to all involved. I look forward to the next meeting.'

Equally, it has been great to see parents and carers during a range of opportunities to meet staff. During these evenings, there has been an energetic buzz and the feedback from staff has been incredibly positive with a togetherness, a sense of belonging and a greater sense of community – one which we continue to strive for and strengthen across the school.

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Our open evening was another huge success with many parents, carers and children excited to see what Mayfield had to offer. I was incredibly proud to hear our senior prefects talking about their Mayfield journey and the changes that have happened. Their confidence, honesty and enthusiasm captivated the audience and they represented the school brilliantly.

It is important that we continue to build on the recognition of pupils who are always working hard, making the right choices and always following the school rules. As part of our reward strategy for our senior pupils, I have had the pleasure of hosting Hot Chocolate Fridays. The nominations this half-term have been: Victory - Discovery - Intrepid - Endeavour - . I asked the Heads of House to select pupils who always do the right thing - and they were an absolute joy to spend time with.

Finally, I would like to take this opportunity to thank all of the school staff for the preparation and work that has gone into putting our half term events together. We are part of a strong community and have a committed team of staff. Whilst we know that there is still a long journey ahead, this has been a very encouraging start to the academic year. Thank you to everybody who has contributed to this positive half term.

Year 10s and Year 11 started their career interview with our career adviser and Year 11s have been applying to college as they need to do this before Christmas. Year 11s have had six colleges and one
