Starting School in Year 7

Before the first day

Whatever your child's age, their first day at school is a huge milestone for them and for you and it is easy for them to become anxious about new routines and social situations. We will work with you to support your child/ren so that they feel confident and see school as a positive and exciting experience. This will help ease those first-day fears.

Getting to Mayfield

Pupils might start to travel here on their own. They might decide to walk, get the bus or use a bike. **If pupils come by bike or scooter, they <u>MUST</u> wear a helmet.** It is a good to start thinking about how they will get to school each day.

The first few weeks

Starting secondary school will be a major step in your child's life and they will need time to adjust. The child's first few weeks at secondary school are crucial in forming their attitude to education. You can be sure that we will be doing everything possible to make it an exciting, stimulating and enjoyable experience.



In September

Things pupils need to know

- ✓ They must have all the correct equipment, so they are ready for learning:
 - a black pen
 - a purple pen
 - 30cm ruler
- a pencil
- a highlighter
- an eraser

- a glue stick
- a scientific calculator
- a reading book

You can purchase an equipment pack with everything from the school via Scopay.

- ✓ They must be wearing the correct uniform. If any item is incorrect, they must borrow uniform from the school.
- ✓ When the teacher invites the pupils to enter the classroom, they must stand behind their chair until they are invited to sit down.
- ✓ They are not allowed mobile phones at school. If a phone is seen or heard, it will be
 confiscated, and parents/carers will be contacted to collect it. They should be turned off
 and in their bags whilst at school.
- They are not allowed to go to the toilet during lesson times unless they have a medical card. Pupils should plan on using the toilet at break times. Please don't worry as there are plenty of toilets on every floor.



School Uniform - What pupils must wear

Pupils at Mayfield should take pride in their uniform and always look smart, including walking to and from school. This gives them a sense of belonging to a community. Parents and carers who accept a place at Mayfield School agree that their children will follow the school uniform requirements. We are very proud of our uniform and how smart the pupils look when wearing it.

The basic uniform and PE kit are the same for all years. Items marked with a * must be purchased from one of the school suppliers, or from the pre-loved uniform shop (see Friends of Mayfield). Supplier leaflets are in the pack.

Optional items which MUST be purchased from the school supplier if you wish your child to wear them:

- Black Mayfield shorts;
- Black Mayfield PE skort;
- House coloured PE tracksuit top.

Other expectations

- Jewellery is restricted to one pair of stud earrings in the lobe of the ear.
- No false nails, no eyelash extensions or brightly coloured nail varnish.
- Minimal makeup.
- Hair must be tied up for practical lessons: PE, Science, Dance and Technology.

Attendance Matters - Attendance at Mayfield

At Mayfield, we pride ourselves on having excellent attendance and coming to school on time, every day.

As parents or guardians, you are responsible for ensuring that your child attends every day the school is open except when a statutory reason applies, for example, an INSET day.

You must notify the school as soon as possible when your child is unexpectedly absent, for example, through sickness. You can do this by:

- Calling the school directly on 023 92693432
- Sending us a message via the StudyBugs app
- Calling or texting the attendance mobile number on 07908 676745

You should only request leave of absence from the school in exceptional circumstances. Term time holiday leave of absence requests will not be authorised.

Where possible, you should book any medical appointments around the school day (before 8.30am and after 3:15pm for seniors).

If your child is at risk of becoming persistently absent, missing 10% of the school year, you must work with us and Portsmouth City Council to help us understand the barriers to your child attending school. We urge you to be open and transparent with us about your child's attendance so that we can support you both.

In rare cases, some children may become severely absent from school. There are many things we can so to support you if your child is reluctant to attend school and their attendance falls below 50%. We ask that all times you proactively engage with us to ensure that we are able to get you and your family the right support.



Year 7 assessment and testing

This year, we have introduced an assessment which will test various areas of literacy to help us identify specific areas where your children may need additional support. Equally, it will help us to identify the areas of strength.

The assessment tool is GL Exact. It is a fully computerised, UK nationally standardised suite of literacy tests and we are now using it for our children from Year 7 to Year 11. It will be used to help us to ensure that the school and teachers are aware of where best to direct intervention at class, small group and individual levels.

We will also be using this to provide parents/carers a much better understanding about areas of literacy need and strength, which will enable them to better support with this at home.



How does it work?

Pupils are given an individual identity number and access code, and log onto a computer and access the test area.

Tests are divided into 5 timed sections that can be stopped and started at the end of each section in case finishing takes longer than the allotted time.

The 5 sections test the following skills:

- 1. Word recognition
- 2. Reading comprehension and reading speed
- 3. Spelling
- 4. Typing to dictation
- 5. Handwriting to dictation

Once all sections are complete, the test is completed and data generated on the pupils through the GL system and used by the school to intervene appropriately.

CAT4

The Cognitive Abilities Test (CAT4) is an assessment of developed abilities in areas known to make a difference to learning and achievement – namely verbal, non-verbal, quantitative and spatial reasoning – and provides the school with an accurate analysis of potential student achievement.

CAT4 provides an understanding of what a child is capable of, as well as identifying which of our students have the potential to achieve more and those who need support in certain subjects. A student with a low quantitative score may struggle with maths, for instance, while one with a low verbal score may find it difficult to access the curriculum. These insights help Mayfield to personalise the learning of individual pupils and unlock hidden potential.

How does it work?

Pupils will complete the CAT4 testing during their ICT lessons in September.

Tests will be divided across lessons into sections looking at different areas. Each will last around ten minutes. Pupils will complete these on the computer. There is no need to revise or prepare for the CAT4 test – it is designed as a diagnostic tool to enable the school to have a better understanding of your child's strengths and weaknesses, allowing for interventions and adaptive approaches in lesson.



Reading

At Mayfield, we believe that the ability to read is a fundamental life skill. It is essential to us all if we are to participate fully in society and the workplace.



Your child will have the opportunity to read in English and throughout the curriculum. These opportunities will involve the 7 strategies of reading.

The 7 strategies of reading are;



How can parents and carers help?

- 1. Encourage reading aloud by you or your child. Hearing a story engages interest and reading requires understanding of punctuation and tone.
- 2. Visit the local or the school library. There's a lot more there than paper books, such as e-readers, competitions and guest readers.
- 3. Be a role model and have books at home or set aside dedicated reading time so your children can see that you enjoy reading too.
- 4. Pick the right text which suits the interests and reading level of your child. Libraries and bookshops can help with areas of interest and popular titles, and we can help with reading ages.
- 5. It doesn't have to be a fiction book! Encyclopedias, newspapers, magazines, and anything with text all encourage reading for pleasure.

Activities Week

Every year we take the opportunity to allow out pupils to broaden their education experience and develop their cultural capital by engaging in a wide variety of trips, visits and activities that enrich and go beyond the ordinary school curriculum.

For Year 7 the activity is School Camp which takes place at Tile Barn in the New Forest.

For 2024-25 this will run the week commencing Monday 7th July.

School Camp allows our pupils to spend some valuable time in an area of outstanding natural beauty, developing their teamwork and cooperation skills, taking part in a variety of challenges and activities – including walks (even at night!), water sports as well as traditional camp activities.

Year 7 School Camp is one of the milestone activities our pupils engage in and we know your child will have a great time!

From Year 8, the offer of trip and visits will widen further.

Payment for Activities Week will be managed through ScoPay.









Parent/Carer Involvement and Immunisations

Home School Agreement

The 'Home School Agreement' helps us to recognise this is a partnership. It outlines the expectations and responsibilities of the children, parents/carers and school in our attempt to provide the best possible education for your child. You and your child will be asked to sign this agreement every year.

Parents' Evenings

We value good communication with parents and carers and hope that this will be the start of a positive relationship between home and school. There will be various opportunities to meet both formally and informally throughout the year.

School Aged Immunisation Service

We would like to inform you about what you can expect from the service while your child is in secondary school. Vaccines are the most effective way to prevent infectious disease and help protect people in the community who cannot receive vaccines. As a service they offer the annual flu vaccination which helps to protect against the flu virus.

Consent for vaccinations is obtained through our online e-consent programme and you will receive information by email from school on how to access it. Please contact us for more information regarding the vaccinations, online e-consent and includes our contact details and the current childhood immunisation schedule.

Medical Information

At Mayfield school, health and well-being is a big priority in our school structure. We have a medical room which is supervised by qualified first aiders. Mrs Rowntree and Mrs Bradshaw are the designated members of staff; however other staff cover the room as and when needed.

Medical Conditions

If your child has a medical condition, please contact Mrs Rowntree and Mrs Bradshaw to discuss your child's needs. Medical Care Plans need to be brought into the school as soon as possible so procedures can be put in place before they start school.

If they suffer from asthma, please bring their individual care plan into school so it can be uploaded onto our management system. As your child is in the senior section, they will keep their inhaler on them. Spare inhalers can be kept in the medical room. We also hold emergency inhalers in school, you must complete an Emergency Inhaler Consent Form to use these. Please contact Mrs Rowntree/Mrs Bradshaw.

Medication

If your child needs medication during the school day, please bring in to school named and with the required dose on. A 'Request for the school to administer medication form' must be completed before any medication can be administered.

Paracetamol

We do hold paracetamol in school should your child need some pain relief during the day. Paracetamol consent must be completed on the Pupil Information Form. We are however, only allowed to give a pupil three doses a term.

Red Box Project

In January 2020, the UK Government rolled out a scheme to all schools and colleges in England making period products free to all students to access. We have a number of packs of period products - sanitary towels, tampons, period pants and re-usable pads, that pupils can come and pick up free of charge. These are available from the red box in the medical room. We also have a products available if they are caught unprepared during the day. If your child is shy about coming to the medical room you can order these online, please contact the medical room.

Whole school systems we use




As a school community, we use ClassCharts to share children's behaviour, attendance records, timetables, homework, detentions and announcements. We use ClassCharts as a primary source of communication with parents. ClassCharts for parents can be accessed via the ClassCharts website, or through the IOS and Android App store.





Main Features



From the main screen, you will be able to:

- View homework tasks that individual teachers set, including the due and issue date.
- Display multiple behaviour graphs which represents an overview of your child's achievements and behaviours over a customisable timeframe.
- Beneath the graphs, you will find a list of behaviour activities relating to your child. Information available includes: the type of behaviour, when it was awarded, who awarded it, the lesson the behaviour was awarded in and how many points the award is worth. There may also be notes to give more information about that behaviour.
- View detention information including, date and time of the detention, the location and who the detention is for. The attendance for the detention is also recorded.
- View attendance information including your child's current attendance %.
- View their timetable including subject, room, time and teacher.




School Cloud for all years.

Access to the Parental Booking system can also be through the link on the school website



This site is used to book extra-curricular clubs, parents' evening, events and activities where payment is not needed.

When you log in to the system, you need to enter your First Name and Last Name and your child's First Name, Surname and Date of Birth. These need to match the information you provided to our school and that is held by our management system.

SCOPAY is for all years.

This can be accessed via an app or website



ScoPay is used to pay for school dinners, equipment and trips etc. As part of our cashless system, ScoPay removes the possibility of loss or theft of money from pupils. Parents credit money to their child's account online via the website with a debit card.

Money is automatically removed from the child's account as they purchase items from the school canteen.



Finding the way around school

Our school is quite big! At first it might feel a bit confusing for your child, but with practise they will find it easier to find their way to classes.

Often classrooms are organised into **departments**. So, each classroom for each subject (like English) might be located in one particular area of the school. Encourage your child to look out for signs telling them where to find different departments. The map of the school is also provided further on in this booklet.



For your child:

Tips for finding your way around.

- Look at the plan of the school at home with friends and family;
- Keep the school plan in your school bag;
- Use the plan to find different areas in school;
- If unsure where to go, ask the nearest person or go to Pupil Services;
- Rooms that start with a '1' are on the first floor. If a room has a
 '2' at the start, it is on floor 2. If the number is under 100, this is on the ground floor.

At the end and beginning of each lesson, adults around the school from the senior section will be in the corridors. They will be there to meet and greet pupils on the way to their lessons as well as help with where to go. Adults will also help to remind pupils of the uniform expectations as they move around the building.




School map - Ground floor

On the first floor you will find English, Humanities – History, Geography, RE, Modern Languages, the senior section Library, Learning Support, and Reflection spaces.










School map – Second floor
