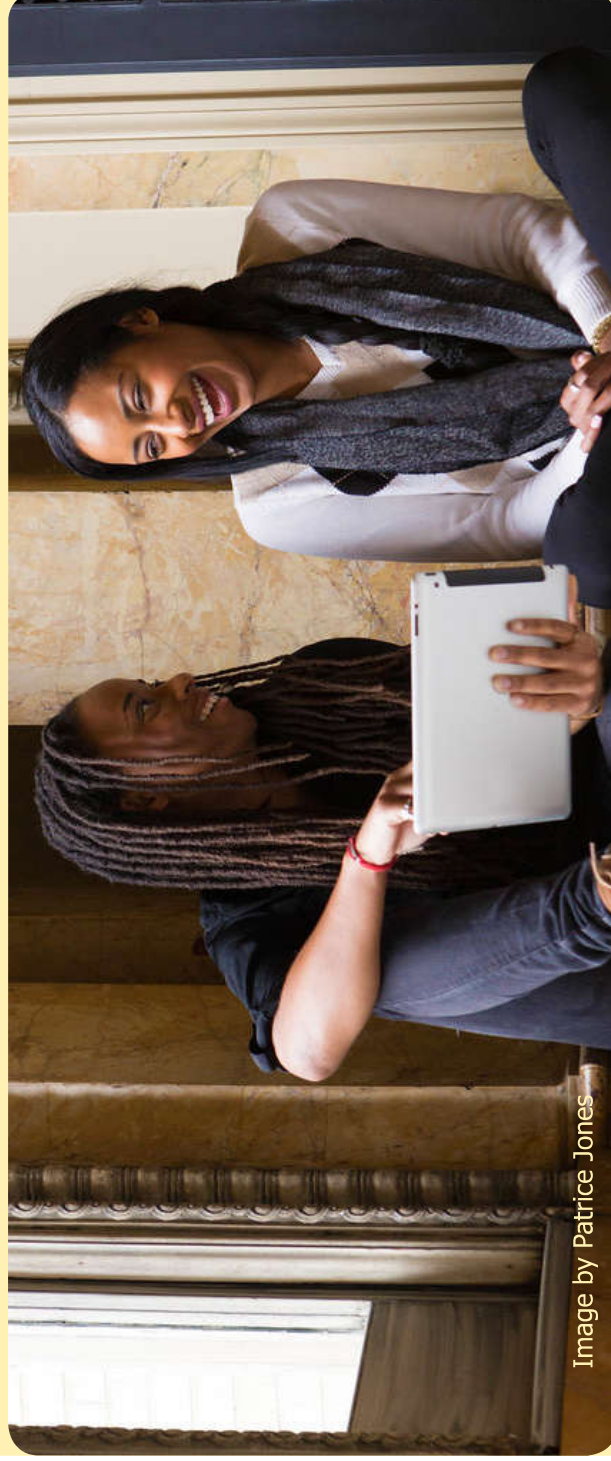

Sharing ideas with others online could be helpful when you're studying or revising.

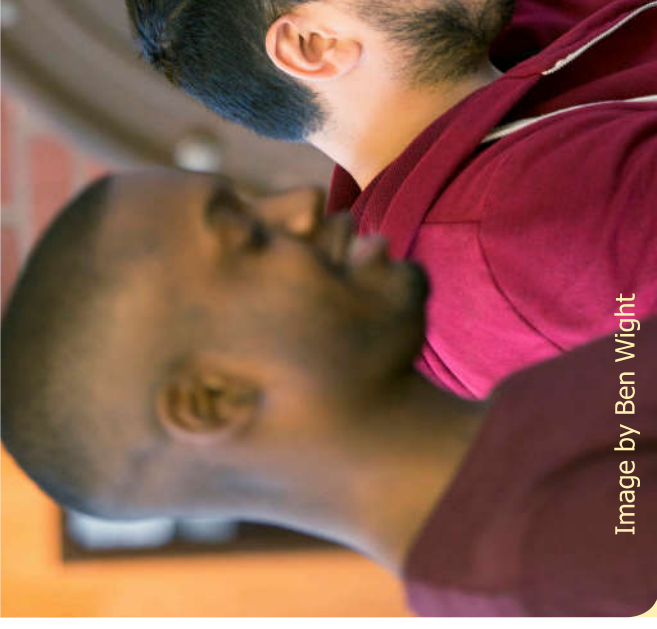

You should be aware that the

- copying or allowing work to be copied
- networking sites prior to an examination
- collusion: working collaboratively
- allowing others to help produce work
- being in possession of confidential information
- the examination;
- exchanging, obtaining, receiving or using any means of communication (e.g. mobile phones)
- failing to report to your centre any suspicious activity
- online; or
- passing on rumours of exam content
